In the meantime, I'd like to thank Mrs Maclean for her hard work this term with Otters children and we wish her all the best when her maternity leave starts during the Spring term.




# Meet your Teacher: Mr Doxford



# **Topic**

### **Autumn Term 1**










Our topic was 'Painters' which heavily focused on art and painting skills. Each class had a story book that was linked to an artist or painting, including 'Katie and the Starry Night', 'Katie and the Sunflowers' and 'The Great Paint' and 'A Beautiful Oops', to name but a few!

By the end of the half term each child painted a piece of art on canvas, which was then displayed in our whole school art gallery in the hall. It was a wonderfully moving experience and a fantastic way to share and celebrate our work with each other.











### Autumn 2

Our topic for Autumn 2 is 'A Victorian Christmas', heavily focused on 'history' and learning about past times. Each class had a story book linked to the topic, including 'A Christmas Carol', 'Lost in the Toy Museum' and 'Oh, Christmas Tree'.







Children are working hard to begin to understand what life was like during Victorian times or to know that things were different 'long ago'. Some classes have been learning about Queen Victoria, whilst others have been learning about what they looked like when they were younger.

Everybody is now getting ready for our Victorian Christmas market on Friday 22nd December and we will share photos of this on Class Dojo and the school website.



We are hoping that as many children and staff as possible will dress up as Victorians to attend our market. Each class will be making Victorian themed items to sell at the Fayre and classes will be competing against each other to make the most profit. All profits made will go into each Class Fund and will be used as a treat later in the year.



In Spring we are looking forward to our new topic, 'Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs' and welcoming in 'M&M Theatre Production' to perform this traditional tale. The topic is largely focused on performing arts and we are excited to share this with you after Christmas.

# **Pathways**



## **Seedling Pathway**

We are so proud with the fantastic start we have made with our Seedlings pathway this academic year. Bunnies, Ladybirds, Squirrels, and Woodpeckers children have thoroughly enjoyed the pathway and curriculum vision of 'learning through play'.

The class staff have been working hard to set up enabling environments to support the children with their learning. We have seen Bunnies classroom transform with areas of learning 'play zones' and a new village shop role play area. Woodpeckers have introduced a sensory, exploratory feel to their classroom whilst Ladybirds have created a new cosy library area. Squirrels have a new outdoor area to look forward to in the Spring term.

The children are all in the festive spirit, creating wonderful surprises to sell at this year's Christmas market and it has been wonderful to see the Seedling children practicing for their Christmas pathway assembly. We regularly come together as a pathway for our weekly Singing and Signing assembly and our new lunch time club 'Work out Wednesdays'.

## **Orchard Pathway**

The children in Orchard have had a wonderful autumn term, we started with the Painters topic in September and engaged well learning about a colour a week. We hope you liked our displays at the art gallery event, we love getting creative and messy! After returning from October half term, we have been exploring Victorian Christmas, all Orchard classes were lucky enough to visit a local Christmas tree farm. We touched and smelt the trees we even got to bring some cut offs back to school.





The children have thoroughly enjoyed swimming every week and are becoming more independent with their dressing/undressing skills, this links to our independence and community area of learning. We would really appreciate your support with this over the Christmas holidays, encouraging your children to be as independent as possible. This includes, washing hands, brushing teeth, pulling down trousers, sitting on the toilet, removing their nappy, putting rubbish in the bin amongst everything else.

In learning and problem solving this term, classes have been using scissors, glue and toy catalogues to create Christmas lists, children have been exploring the concept of big and small through presents and baubles. We have used different mark making tools to decorate trees and crackers, explored numbers through sensory trays and watching Christmas films.







We have been lucky to work with the school's Occupational therapist over the term to improve our knowledge and practice with sensory circuits. These circuits link with the sensory processing and emotional regulation area of learning. All of the children across the pathway take part with sensory circuits throughout the school day, these help them to regulate and engage their brains ready for learning. We use equipment such as gym balls, textured stepping stones, sensory scarves, trampettes and bean bags.








This term staff attended a training session all about intensive interaction, we are working hard with the children and their communication. In the area of social communication all classes are giving children opportunities throughout the day to communicate in a variety of different ways including PECs, Makaton, intensive interaction, Attention Autism and many more personalised strategies. # **Woodlands Pathway**

What an exciting first term we have had in Woodlands Pathway! Our cross-curricular ethos has provided some incredible learning opportunities for the children in Grasshoppers, Bumblebees, Wildcats, Chipmunks, Badgers and Robins which we are keen to share with you in this newsletter.

For our art-themed first half term topic, Chipmunks, Wildcats and Badgers were lucky enough to go on an exciting trip to Spotty Pots in Studley. The children designed a 6-inch tile to represent their personalities and then used special ceramic tile paint to bring their designs to life. After being heated in the kilns, the tiles were ready to bring home and I'm sure you can agree that the finished product looks great!







We have also been lucky to have had lots of sporting opportunities in Woodlands this term. Grasshoppers and Chipmunks have made great progress with their swimming skills during their weekly lessons, and Badgers class have enjoyed the opportunity to hone their golf skills on a Wednesday morning. Children from a range of Woodlands classes have also been selected for a football trip to Villa and the Panathlon Challenge where a few medals were won. Well done Woodlands!









Finally our current topic Victorian Christmas has been very engaging for all our children during the festive period. Children have been immersed in Christmas themed texts A Christmas Carol and Lost in the Toy Museum and have used these as a stimulus for some great writing. In the Woodlands Pathway, we have also been busy rehearsing for our Christmas Performance on 19th December at Holy Cross Church – we can't wait to show you our Christmas songs to retell the Nativity story.

funding for. This year we have invested in a new stage for the school, ensuring that our children have the optimum platform to show you their wonderful assemblies and seasonal productions.


